Let's take to the streets on IWD 8 March 2019 to call for:

1. End gender-based violence & harassment

One in three women globally is affected by domestic violence. 63% of female workers aged 18-24 have experienced sexual harassment at work.

2. End the gender pay gap - for a living wage for all

More than 50 years after women went on strike for equal pay, the gender pay gap is still 14%. Nurses and midwives taking strike action against low pay are an example of the type of movement we need to build to challenge the gender pay gap in practice

3. End precarious conditions in work and housing

We protested, struck & canvassed in our tens of thousands to win repeal & abortion rights -- we said YES to choice -- let's continue the struggle for full equality for everyone.
